### Institute Updates

1. Our alumnus Sh. Jay Chaudhry (ECE '80), the CEO and Founder of cloud-based information security firm Zscaler, has endowed the IIT (BHU) Foundation, a US-based non-profit association of IIT (BHU) alumni, with a US \$1 million donation. This donation will fund IIT (BHU)'s Entrepreneurship Center focusing on student, faculty, and entrepreneurship development. Further, Dr. Deep Jariwala (MET '10) will help establish a Software Innovation Center at the Institute and identify a faculty member to fill the role of the 'Jay Chaudhry Professor of Software Innovation' who will manage and oversee the Software Innovation Center. In addition to a professorship and Innovation Center, this donation will fund a lecture series on software innovation and a software technology seed fund.

2. Sangeeta Mishra, a fourth-year student from the Department of Chemistry, brought laurels to the Institute by winning TechGig Geek Goddess 2021, country's largest coding event for women in technology. Sangeeta outshined around 73,000 other female coders and was crowned as the Coding Champion in the event's 2021 edition.

#### Implementation of National Education Policy 2020

After implementation of NEP-2020, the Institute provides a greater flexibility for teaching-learning with a highly 'Student Centric' approach.

- The semester(s) drop option provides opportunity to students for startup/entrepreneurship/ extended practical learning during regular academic programs as per their interest. The student may re-enter the academic program and earn the degree.
- The Institute has made detailed guidelines for credit transfer of courses from other Institutes and through NPTEL/SWAYAM etc. to give students greater flexibility to plan their academic career and pursue academic interest. Students can also earn credit during semester drop and transfer the earned credit for the award of degree.
- In line with recommendations of NEP-2020 for multidisciplinary learning, guidelines for open electives from another discipline are formulated to make the learning of open elective courses more meaningful.
- Further, a provision for 'Minor Discipline' courses was also introduced to provide students an opportunity to learn another academic area for the students doing very well in their major academic program. It is expected to supplement learning in the major discipline and help in developing interdisciplinary knowledge for problem solving in areas of engineering, technology and science. The minor courses will run during Vth to VIIIth semesters (9-11 credits each semester).
- Integrated Dual Degree students will be allowed to change their discipline after 4 years of B.Tech. in the original discipline and M.Tech. in the new discipline. This provides better flexibility to students related to their career options.



### Inspiring Alumni



Sh. Jay Chaudhry (ECE '80)

A story that began 60 years ago in a quiet Indian village nestled at the foothills of the Himalayas. It is a story about a village boy who — through a combination hard work. of luck. and measured risk-taking has become an inspiring story for Indians. millions of Jav Chaudhry was born in 1958, in a small village in Himachal Pradesh, India. His parents were farmers, with a modest plot of

and that they used to grow wheat, corn, and sugarcane. Until he was in his late teens, the village had no electricity or running water. His high school headmaster picked up on his raw talent and started challenging him to excel in his studies. Jay didn't realize it at the time, but education would become his springboard to a different life.

After completing pre-university as a gold medalist at Himachal University, Jay set his sights on joining an engineering college. He recalls his path as "more accidental than designed or chosen." He was unfamiliar with the Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) at the time, but another teacher who saw his potential encouraged him to apply. He was soon admitted to IIT (BHU), Varanasi, and became the first in his village to go to an engineering college. At IIT (BHU), Jay studied Electronics Engineering alongside some of the best and the brightest students across India. He made lifelong friendships, some of which would play a big role later in his career. It was popular at the time to go to an American university to earn a Master's degree, and Jay became part of that trend.

In the late 1990s, the internet was beginning to take off in the US. Netscape, a pioneer internet startup had just debuted in public markets with a blockbuster IPO, inspiring a generation of young entrepreneurs. By this time, Jay had built up a decade of experience in technology across engineering, sales, marketing, and management roles in large companies like IBM, NCR, and Unisys.


As we conclude the year 2021, we are extremely grateful to our alumni for the support they have shown to Alma Communiqué - our alumni newsletter.
