Institute Updates

- 1. IIT (BHU) Foundation Inc., a US-based non-profit association of IIT (BHU) alumni, received a \$1.3 million gift from our alumnus Sh. Ramesh Srinivasan (MET '82), President & CEO Agilysys Inc., USA, for setting up a Students Activity Center (Sports) at the Institute. In recognition of his generous gift, the Students Activity Center (Sports) would be named as 'Ramesh Srinivasan Students Activity Center'. The Students Activity Center will be a place where students will enhance their leadership and collaboration skills through participation in team sports and other activities. Well-rounded students with intellectual ability equal to their emotional intelligence is a hallmark of IIT (BHU), and his gift will help ensure that this continues to be true in the future. This is the largest ever single gift to IIT (BHU), Varanasi, signifying a new chapter in alumni support for the alma mater.
- 2. Dr. Badri Prasad (MET '66) has donated generously for the institution of the 'Late Sudha Prasad Endowment Scholarship', in honor of his wife. This endowment scholarship shall be awarded every year to a selected female student of any discipline of the B.Tech./IDD first-year program in the Institute on merit-cum-means criteria. It will be disbursed from the annual interest earned from the corpus at Rs. 3,000/- per month for a duration of 10 months in each academic year over the course of four years of the B.Tech./IDD program, subject to the student's satisfactory performance in each semester. From the fourth year onwards of the commencement of the scholarship, four students shall receive the scholarship simultaneously, each belonging to the I/II/III/IV year of B.Tech./IDD Program, respectively. The scholarship shall begin from the academic session 2022-23.
- 3. The Institute has announced the 'Shyama Varshney BENCO-64 Best Educator Award', instituted by alumni of BENCO 1964 batch in memory of their batchmate Late Shyama Varshney, to be conferred on a faculty of erstwhile BENCO unit of the Institute every year. This award is being conferred on Dr. R. K. Singh, an Associate Professor at the Department of Electrical Engineering, for displaying overall excellence in teaching. The award carries a citation apart from a cash amount Rs. 25,000/- (Rs. Twenty Five Thousands Only). Dr. R. K. Singh will be felicitated very soon.
- 4. On Teachers' Day, in an event to celebrate teaching and Dr. Radhakrishnan's significant contribution to education, IIT (BHU) honored its teaching faculty. Five professors were awarded the 'Best Teacher Award 2021' in four different categories. Dr. Arnab Sarkar in UG First year, Dr. Sanjeev Kumar Mahto in PG classes, Dr. Abhishek Kumar Srivastava and Dr. Rakesh Kumar Singh jointly in UG Sciences and Humanities, and Prof. Vikas Kumar Dubey in the UG Engineering category, won laurels for their exemplary passion and dedication to train future leaders.

Placement/Internship Updates

With the dedicated efforts of the Training and Placement Cell, the internship/placement season is being successfully conducted. As of 3rd October, 2021, we have seen 227 preplacement offers and 419 paid internship offers in diverse job profiles. The highest pre-placement and internship stipends offered are Rs. 52,50,000/- per annum and Rs. 2,00,000/- per month, respectively, with the average being Rs. 22,02,555/-per annum and Rs. 74,287/- per month, respectively.

Dr. Sukumar Bandhopadhyay (MIN '70)



He has recently been awarded the 'Robert Stefanko Distinguished Achievement Award in Mineral Engineering' by the College Of Earth and Mineral Sciences at the Pennsylvania State University. He completed his B.Sc. and M.Tech. in Mining Engineering from IIT (BHU) and was also honored with

the 'IIT BHU Alumnus of the Century In Making Award' during the Centenary Celebrations in 2019. He has served as a Professor for more than three decades at the University of Alaska Fairbanks. He is currently the director of Mining Analytics, International (MAI), a consulting firm with expertise in AI, big data, and data analytics.

Dr. Akhlesh Lakhtakia (ECE '79)

He was recently honored by the Society of Photo-Optical Instrumentation Engineers (SPIE) with the '2022 SPIE Smart Structures and Materials Lifetime Achievement Award'. This award recognizes his enormous contributions to smart structures and materials and his huge impact on the field's



community. He had completed his B.Tech. and D.Sc. in Electronics and Communication Engineering from IIT (BHU) in 1979 and 2006, respectively. Currently, he is Evan Pugh University Professor and Charles Godfrey Binder Professor of Engineering Sciences and Mechanics at the Pennsylvania State University.

Sh. Ramesh Srinivasan (MFT '82)

Sh. Ramesh Srinivasan is a graduate of the batch of 1982 Department the Metallurgical Engineering. After his graduation, he went on to get an MBA from the Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore in 1984. His journey of gaining experience in the extensive business field and becoming an accomplished CEO comes from the various organizations he has

worked with and led. He has time and again demonstrated leadership success in technology, enterprise software, and general management across multiple industries and is currently the President & CEO of Agilysys (Nasdaq: AGYS). Before his appointment at Agilysys, he served as the CEO of Ooyala Inc. in Santa Clara (Silicon Valley), California, the President & CEO of Innotrac Corporation, and spent nine years of his professional career at Bally Technologies Inc. (NYSE: BYI), where he was eventually promoted to President & CEO and member of the Board of Directors.

As an expression of gratitude for the great success in his professional life, Sh. Ramesh Srinivasan recently made a generous donation of \$1.3 million towards the construction of a Students Activity Center (SAC) for sports at the Institute. This is the largest single gift ever made to IIT (BHU), ushering in a new chapter of alumni support.

Did You Know?



The beloved Kul Geet of our Institution - "मधुर मनोहर अतीव सुन्दर, यह सर्वविद्या की राजधानी" - was composed by Dr. Shanti Swaroop Bhatnagar, who was a Professor at the University for 19 years. The Kul Geet was sung for the first time in the year 1923.



In 1930, a chimney was established behind the Department of Mechanical Engineering. The 30-metre chimney was known as BENCO chimney which provided electricity to half of Varanasi. The iconic chimney was re-erected during the Institute's centenary celebrations.



On 10th March, 1931, the foundation stone of the campus' Vishwanath Temple was laid by Saint Taponidhi Krishnaswami. It was located at the center of the arc of the campus. The construction of the Vishwanath Temple was completed at the end of 1966.



The main entrance gate and boundary walls of our University were built in 1941. The donations for construction of the gate were made by the Maharaja Sahib of Balrampur, Maharaja Pateshvari Prashad Singh. The gate came to be known as the 'Singh Dwar'.



In the years 1968-71, the three colleges (BENCO, MINMET and TECHNO) were merged into one and the Institute of Technology was established. Dr. Gopal Tripathi became the first Director of IT-BHU. From 1971-72, students were admitted through IIT-JEE for UG courses and GATE for PG courses.



After decades of effort, finally, it was on 29th June, 2012, that the Institute of Technology was declared as an independent body by a separate Act of Parliament. The Institute henceforth renamed and came to be known as the Indian Institute of Technology (BHU), Varanasi.
