
#### **ABOUT IIT (BHU)**



The Indian Institute of Technology (Banaras Hindu University), Varanasi is situated in the magnificent campus of Banaras Hindu University at the southern end of the ancient city of Varanasi on the banks of the holy river Ganga. Engineering Education in Banaras Hindu University commenced in 1919 with the establishment of Banaras Engineering College (BENCO). The Institution has also pioneered engineering education by being the first in the country to start degree courses in Mining, Metallurgy, Ceramic Engineering and Pharmaceutics with the establishment of the College of Mining and Metallurgy and the College of Technology in the year 1923 and 1932 respectively. In 1969 these three colleges were amalgamated to form the Institute of Technology. The Institute of Technology, Banaras Hindu University (IT-BHU), has been converted into Indian Institute of Technology (Banaras Hindu University), Varanasi by the Government of India on 29th June, 2012.



#### **ABOUT LEAP**



The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India has launched a three week Leadership for Academicians Program (LEAP), which includes one week foreign training component in one of the top 100 universities in global rankings.

This program will be conducted by a few select top ranked institutions nationally. IIT (BHU), Varanasi, has conducted this program last year and this year again selected by MHRD to implement LEAP. This initiative primarily aims to identify and train such faculty who are expected to move into academic leadership role in near future where high level of governance and management skills would be required. #### **LEAP 2018-19**





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IIT (BHU) Varanasi was selected to conduct MHRD's flagship Leadership for Academcians Program (LEAP), 2018-19 under the Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) Scheme. The first edition of LEAP was successfully conducted from February 25 – March 09, 2019 at IIT (BHU), Varanasi and from March 10 - March 15, 2019 at Penn State University, Pennsylvania.

At IIT (BHU), Varanasi more than 15 eminent resource persons were invited to conduct the sessions and similarly several eminent faculty members from Penn State University facilitated the sessions in USA. The program delivery and implementation included a mix of lectures, discussions, hands on activities, individual and team work, project work, assignments, quizzes, panel and group discussions, case studies, technology enhanced learning, presentations, report writing, campus visits, industry visit, social gatherings and plenty of opportunities for networking and collaboration. Curriculum topics on academic leadership, governmental and institutional policies, strategic planning, institutional accountability, intercultural communication, performance and financial management, etc. were covered with emphasis on holistic leadership development.
